FRENCH CULTURAL PATTERNS

The summer version of the AUCP's cornerstone course explores the French societal structures and habits from the vantage point of the French "Art of Living" – from the concept of the table as the center of society to the attitudes and values that give importance to history, regional lands, family ties, wine, and food. *The summer French Cultural Patterns is taught in English.*

FIELD TRIPS

The Vineyards

Geography and history of France through an exploration of wine.

The Mediterranean

Marseille and its vibrant port, an example of ethnic and religious pluralism.

Farmland of Provence

Ancient cheese-making traditions and the taste of fresh goat cheese on the farm!

Hilltop villages

Architecture and traditions of Provence.

INTENSIVE FRENCH

All language courses are taught in French and benefit from an active approach to the development of conversation and listening skills, as well as written comprehension, accurate usage and current idiomatic expression. Thematic, contextual course modules target pragmatic language needs and desired domains of fluency.
